

Governors' Report to Parents Academic Year 2020-21







Dear Parents,

I have great pleasure in writing this note to you, the parents of our wonderful children here at Wood Memorial Primary School. I hope you find the information throughout the report interesting and of use.

It has been an extremely difficult year for everybody due to the Covid-19 pandemic, particularly during the lockdown period where we, as a school, focused heavily on the wellbeing of all children.

I am proud of how the school reacted and adapted to very fast moving times whilst always following the guidance of Welsh Government and the Local Authority. Credit must be paid to the whole teaching staff who quickly put plans in place for home learning to commence. This was alongside the school remaining open for vulnerable pupils, and pupils of key workers.

At this point, I must express my deepest thanks to every single parent and carer who took on the role of teacher – I know for one, I found it extremely challenging. But together we got through that very difficult period and the focus moving forward is to follow the guidance as always and help to keep ourselves safe.

Staff ensured that every single child had the opportunity to take part in home learning. If a child was unable to access work digitally, paper copies of the work were delivered home and also iPads and laptops were provided where requested.

The children have amazed me in how resilient they have been but we know that the pandemic will have had an impact so as I said at the start, the focus will continue to be on the wellbeing of each and every child in the school.

Wood Memorial has always operated an open door policy. As I am sure you can appreciate we are trying to avoid, where possible, visits into the school. However, please note that teachers are still available for you to contact and you can do this by email.

Despite the pandemic the school has continued to strive to achieve goals, and over the last 12 months we have seen the following:

For the period 2020/21 we had the pleasure of Mrs Wyn-Hughes leading our school in the role as Acting Headteacher. Mrs Wyn-Hughes took up a new post as Headteacher at another primary school in Flintshire in September 2021 and we wish her the best of luck in her new role. She did a great job in the two years she was Acting Headteacher at Wood Memorial as she will be missed by everybody.

Mrs Williams who was Headteacher secured a permanent position at GwE following two years on secondment at GwE.

The movement in leadership and a slight restructure has opened doors for other members of staff at Wood Memorial. I am really pleased that so many members of the team have been able to be offered opportunities which will benefit all children at school. The new roles are listed below:

Attendance Information

We have been working hard on whole school attendance this year. We have first day of absence calls to ensure all pupils who can be in school are attending. We link in well with the inclusion welfare officer and monitor poor attendance. Parents are invited into school should a pupils attendance fall to a concerning level. We send out regular letters for all parents about the importance of pupils attending school in order to reach their full potential. Attendance percentage of possible sessions for pupils on roll and leavers of compulsory school age only shows attendance has improved but we are still working on further improving this figure.

School Trips, Residential Trips and Extra-Curricular Activities

Despite a great deal of disruption due to Lockdowns/home learning, pupils were involved in a wide range of trips and workshops including the following:

- Chester Zoo workshops held interactively for all classes R-Y6 and all classes will visit Chester Zoo
- Food and hygiene 'Pirates of the chilli bean' workshop
- Financial Literacy project held in school for Year 6
- Year 6 'sick to death' trip to Chester to support current class topic
- PC Lee has been in to school and delivered sessions to pupils across the school. He also facilitated some small group sessions regarding racial tolerance for some KS2 pupils.

Healthy Eating and Drinking

As a school we are part of the Healthy Schools initiative and we have recently gained the NQA. School works hard to ensure children are made aware of how to stay healthy and safe.

Children are encouraged to bring in healthy snacks in key stage 2 or use the pupil led fruit tuckshop. Pupils are provided with fruit in Foundation Phase. School has implemented elements of the Healthy Eating in School Standards which ensure all food given to children in school meets strict nutritional guidelines. This includes food served in the school kitchen.

We have a water cooler in school and all pupils are encouraged to drink water throughout the day.

School Development Plan (SDP)

<u>Priority 1</u>: To raise standards of extended writing across the school with particular focus on More Able and Talented.

<u>Priority 2:</u> To raise standards of numeracy for all pupils with particular focus on Problem Solving and reasoning in both Key Stages.

<u>Priority 3:</u> To adopt a whole school approach to wellbeing and work as part of a cluster to embed the 5 ways to wellbeing initiative

<u>Priority 4</u>: To create effective and passionate readers by raising the profile and importance of higher order reading skills with a particular focus on early reading and phonetic blending in foundation phase and comprehension strategies through modelling and supportive practice in ks2

Policy and Curriculum

The policy committee meet once a term to discuss school policy and practice. Governing Body agreed to adopt all Flintshire policies in the first meeting of the school year.

We have discussed the changes to the curriculum as the new curriculum is developed. We have looked at the way we teach and how we can improve our pedagogy.

Pupils are fully involved in developing our curriculum and help decide on topics and which direction their learning takes. We try, wherever possible, to provide rich tasks which children can get fully involved in. We start most topics with an immersion day so the pupils become fully involved in their topic.

Finance and Personnel

School Budget was shared twice during the school year and the LA finance officer attended. We approved small purchases and staffing changes as well as looking at budget forecasts and current spends. The overall budget is positive however reductions in core budgets and falling pupil numbers means we need to ensure we are making efficiencies. School used the pupil deprivation grant to deliver initiatives such as Nessy, a reading programme. It also funds the daily reading programme, ELSA and our family support worker. We write a plan each year and this is published on the school website.

Building Development/Health and Safety

As well as conducting health and safety audits in school, Governors looked at areas of the school that needed general repairs and maintenance. These included the area outside of the Reception classroom and the Reception classroom roof.

The following statutory committees were also set.

- Staff Discipline and Dismissal Committee
- Pupil Discipline and Exclusions Committee
- Disciplinary and Dismissal Appeals
- Complaints

Additional Learning Needs

It is the responsibility of the school to do all it can to maximise the learning opportunity for every child regardless of their level of ability. Removing the barriers that would otherwise hinder levels of achievement is seen as very important to us. As a school, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our resources, teaching strategies and environment to allow all children to be able to pursue their potential.

This year we have continued to draw up and maintain relevant Individual Education Plans for children at School Action or School Action Plus. This involved regular meetings and reviews taking place between class teachers, parents, pupils and outside agencies. The Behaviour Support Specialist, Educational Psychologist, School Nurse, Inclusion Welfare Officer have been close at hand to offer specific advice and support for individual children and families.

Mrs Wyn Hughes is supported in school by Mrs Dorbin who withdraws children for small group support and supports staff in the writing of literacy targets. This year we trained two members of staff to deliver the ELSA programme. This focusses on supporting pupils emotional literacy. We have seen the impact of the sessions and will train more staff next year.

Parental Involvement

As a school we believe our relationships with parents is a strength. We have worked hard to develop this relationship over recent years and we now have an active Parent Forum who meet regularly. We also seek the views of parents once a year in our parent surveys.

We have developed an active Parent Support programme which was led by our Family Liaison Officer, Mrs Ridge. Unfortuately we have been unable to run any of these courses due to COVID restrictions but we are hopeful they can resume next year.

Language Development

The first language of the majority of our pupils is English. For those pupils whose first language is one other than English we access support through the EAL team (English as an Additional Language). This might take the form of an EAL teacher visiting and working with pupils or through support for class teachers. This year we had a 'planted adult' support pupils in school over a term. This initiative was introduced by Flintshire EAL service to provide more intensive support for pupils who have English as an Additional Language.

We are a school in Wales so we promote the development of Welsh as a second language. This has been a school focus over recent years and a number of staff have now taken part in the Welsh Sabbatical Scheme. We have established a Criw Cymraeg and are undertaking the 'Cymraeg Campus' initiative to develop Welsh across the school.

Welsh is taught through structured play activities and Welsh puppets and books in the Foundation Phase and through an advised scheme in Key Stage 2.

School also promotes welsh around the school using welsh greetings and commands. Wherever possible, signs will be bilingual.

Community Links

We have strong links in the community and try to be involved in many aspects of life in Saltney.

We have a youth worker from St Marks Church visit the school every other Tuesday to deliver an assembly to our Foundation Phase pupils.

We take part in the Remembrance Service at Hawarden Memorial and collect for the Royal British Legion.

We supported a number of charities this year and families have proved to be very generous.

We are still involved in the School Beat programme and PC Ashton visits school regularly to work with pupils on topics such as stranger danger and substance misuse.

Disability Accessibility

School continues to work with children and families who have disabilities to ensure school meets all of their needs. Over recent years we have had ramps fitted to all exit doors and have had the fire alarm changed so it also now lights up (as required for pupils with hearing loss). We have had doors widened within the school so that they are accessible for all.

<u>Toilets</u>

In Wood Memorial School there are toilets allocated for both Foundation Phase and KS2 pupils. The Nursery and Reception pupils have their own set of toilets. Year One and two pupils have a shared set of girl and boy toilets available which has been partitioned. KS2 pupils have one set of girl and boy toilets located along the junior corridor. We have sanitary bins in the junior girl's toilets, staff toilets and the changing area in years one and two. We also have two nappy bins in school which are maintained and collected by an external company.

All toilets are cleaned by the school cleaners at the end of every school day. During the school day all staff ensure the toilets are kept to a reasonable standard and they have access to cleaning equipment should the need arise. All toilet facilities are subject to a regular daily check by the Caretaker and an annual Health & Safety check is carried out by the Health & Safety committee.
